The Ethyl Corporation Records were donated to the American Heritage Center in several shipments. James Boudreau via Gordon Saxon donated many of the records in 1955. William Adams donated the historical documents used for exhibition in 1984, and other portions were donated in 1981 and 1988.

The records were in good condition and order was arranged as seemed most useful to the researcher. Newspaper clippings were replaced by preservation copies

#### History

The Ethyl Corporation, chartered in Delaware in 1924, originated from the research efforts of scientists/engineers Charles F. Kettering and Thomas Midgley, Jr. Midgley worked for Dayton Engineering Laboratories Company, a research group first established by Kettering in 1916. In 1921, the two men played an important role in the discovery of tetraethyl lead as an anti-knock agent in automobile engines.

Kettering named this tetraethyl lead "Ethyl" gasoline and made it first available to the public in 1923. Midgley and Kettering sponsored the founding of the General Motors Chemical Company in order to provide large-scale distribution of Ethyl gasoline. At the same time, researchers at Standard Oil of New Jersey developed economical methods of manufacturing tetraethyl lead. The two companies joined forces in 1924 to create Ethyl Gasoline Corporation, a name later changed to Ethyl Corporation (Delaware).

Charles Kettering was the first president of Ethyl, serving until 1925. Midgley served as vice-president and general manager of the corporation until his death in 1944. Colonel James Boudreau served as vice-president and director of public relations for Ethyl of Virginia until his retirement in 1966. Earl Bartholomew, an engineer who performed research for Ethyl, developed several important patents for the corporation, including a special "scavenger" mixture of bromine and chlorine. Bartholomew also developed an engine that could use tetraethyl lead and remain within clean air regulations

In 1962 the Albemarle Paper Manufacturing Company bought Ethyl Corporation, a company thirteen times the size of Albemarle. Albemarle then changed its name to Ethyl Corporation (Virginia). Today the Ethyl Corporation is among Fortune 500 companies and produces high-performance chemicals for the petroleum industry, specialty chemicals, plastics, and aluminum products. Ethyl also has interests in oil, coal and gas.

#### Scope and Content

The Ethyl Corporation Records, 1823-1983, contain historical material gathered by Colonel James Boudreau for exhibits in connection with the history of the petroleum industry and Ethyl anniversary celebrations. Many of the documents chronicle the history of petroleum in Pennsylvania. Most of the historical documents are originals, but the photographs are mainly reproductions.

Publications (Series IV) contain many pamphlets, papers and speeches put out by Ethyl researchers. N-File Publications and General Publications contain the same types of publications, but are in separate subseries because the Ethyl Corporation filed N-Files under the letter "N" and kept General Publications separate.
