Biographical Note: (Who was/is this person?) Joseph M. Carey and Robert D. Carey were the only father and son to be elected governors of Wyoming. Joseph Carey served on the Wyoming Territorial Supreme Court from 1871-1876, served as delegate to Congress from the territory from 1885 until statehood in 1889, and was one of the state's first United States senators from 1890 to 1895. In 1910 he was elected governor of Wyoming and served for one term. His son Robert served one term as governor of Wyoming from 1919 to 1923 and was a United States senator from 1930 to 1937.
Scope & Content Note: (What is this accretion about?) This accretion contains a letter book with correspondence to and from Joseph M. Carey and Robert D. Carey regarding cattle-related business, transactions, and logistics in Wyoming from 1890-1892.
