Biography

Seymour S. Bernfeld was born 31 March 1909 in New York City. He attended Fordham University and graduated with a law degree in 1932. He moved to Montana in 1934 and later to Casper, Wyoming, where he practiced law and was also a special agent for the U.S. Department of the Interior from 1937 to 1942. He was also an avid amateur photographer and took nearly 2,700 images while in Wyoming, often while on duty for the Department of the Interior. Bernfeld served in the U.S. Marine Corps's Personnel and Legal Sections of the Third Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters during World War II from 1942 to 1945. He was married to Marjorie D. Brogden in Cheyenne, Wyoming, on 25 December 1946.

Bernfeld served as chief enforcement officer of the U.S. Office of Price Administration in Cheyenne, Wyoming, from 1946 to 1947. From 1947 to 1957 he served as prosecutor for military commissions under international law at Okinawa, Ryukyus Islands, Japan; general civilian counsel to the Ryukyus Command, U.S. Army at Okinawa, Japan; and legal adviser to the U.S. Civil Administration of the Ryukyus Islands, Japan.

He joined the legal department of American Metal Climax, Inc. (AMAX) in 1957 and was chief counsel for AMAX Explorations, Inc., a subsidiary of AMAX. AMAX was originally incorporated in 1887 as the American Metal Company, Limited (AMCO), a New York company concerned with copper, lead and zinc mining. Its present name came after its 1957 merger with Climax Molybdenum Company, which mined molybdenum near Climax, Colorado.

He served as a representative of AMAX for the U.S. delegation to the U.N. Committee on Peaceful Uses of the Deep Sea Beds from 1968 to 1973 and the U.S. State Department Advisory Committee on the Law of the Sea. He wrote *A Short History of American Metal Climax, Inc.* in 1963 along with *Practices and Pitfalls in the Acquisition of Minerals in the United States* in 1966.

Bernfeld retired from AMAX in 1973 and died on 20 February 1975 in Denver, Colorado.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains materials relating to Bernfeld's work as an attorney in Wyoming and Japan and for AMAX from 1934 to 1975.

Most of the personal papers consist of 2,693 photographs and negatives that Bernfeld took while traveling as a U.S. Dept. of Interior Agent. Bernfeld donated the negatives, and in 1976 Ann M. Gallivan, a University of Wyoming student, made print copies of these negatives. The photographs are 4 x 5 inches in size and document the towns, historic landmarks, national parks and forests, and ranches and are a record of Bernfeld's travels, which followed the main highways in Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, Montana, North and South Dakota, and Nebraska from 1934 to 1942 and 1946. The photographs' original chronological order has been maintained.

The personal papers also contain one photograph and a write-up of Harvey Morgan, who was killed on 27 June 1870 near Lander, Wyoming, by a group of Indians. The Indians scalped Morgan and the body was buried at Camp Brown (now the town of Lander). It was discovered while a water pipe line was being dug near the town of Lander in 1908. Bernfeld stopped to have his picture taken with the skull in 1937. Also included in the personal papers are a set of 79 autographs (the originals are in the safe) from 1890-1956 that Bernfeld collected, mostly of Wyoming Governor Amos W. Barber and New York's U.S. Senator Robert F. Wagner.

Bernfeld's work as an attorney during the U.S. military's governing of the Ryukyu Islands of Japan contains reports, correspondence, photographs, and military and Japanese laws and ordinances. There is also a small amount of material relating to the history of the islands and Japanese history. There is only a yearbook relating to Bernfeld's World War II service. Some of the material is in Japanese.

Bernfeld's AMAX Office files consists of reports, correspondence, legal documents, and memorandum regarding his work as attorney for AMAX and AMAX Exploration Inc. These files document AMAX's operations in copper, lead, and zinc mining in the U.S. and other areas of the world, especially Iran. There is also approximately one cubic foot of materials relating to Bernfeld's research of the history of AMAX, including reminiscences by company officials, photocopies of early AMAX director's correspondence, transcripts of Bernfeld's interviews with company officials, and histories of predecessor companies. This series also contains speeches, correspondence and reports relating to Bernfeld representing AMAX on the U.N. Committee on the Peaceful Uses of the Sea Bed.

Series Description

The Seymour S. Bernfeld Papers have been arranged into three series:

Series I. Personal Papers, 1934-1975. 2.45 cubic ft. (3 boxes) Arranged alphabetically.

Consists primarily of the photographs and negatives taken by Bernfeld while in Wyoming from 1934 to 1942 and 1946. The photographs, document the national parks, highway systems, historic sites and landscape of Wyoming. The photographs are arranged chronologically and are a record of Bernfeld's travels. Following the description of the photographs, the number of photographs in each file is noted in parenthesis, i.e. Estes Park (16). This series also contains miscellaneous biographical information and photograph albums.

Series II. U.S. Military Government in Japan Materials, 1944-1973. 5.45 cubic ft. (6 boxes).

This series has been arranged into three sub-series: general legal files, Government of the Ryukyu Islands laws, and miscellaneous subject files. These materials contain mostly legal case files regarding Bernfeld's work as a lawyer for the U.S. military government in Japan. These files contains interviews, photographs, legal briefs and other materials regarding court martials, murders, marriage procedures, work contracts, and immigration for which the military government was charged with overseeing. Also included in the volumes are general military orders. Some of this material is in Japanese.

Series III. AMAX Office Files, 1888-1974. 8 cubic ft. (8 boxes). Consists of Bernfeld's office files regarding his work as a lawyer for AMAX and AMAX Exploration, Inc. Much of this material is photocopies. This series has been divided into three sub-series: office files, U.N. Committee on Peaceful Uses of the Sea Bed, and AMAX History files. From 1957 to 1963 the office files are in bound numbered volumes and from 1964 to 1972 the files are in folders. This sub-series also contains a typescript copy of the manuscript *Practices and Pitfalls in the Acquisition of Minerals in the United States*. The second sub-series contains reports, speeches and correspondence regarding the use of the seabeds. The third sub-series contains materials relating to the writing of and manuscript for *A Short History of American Metal Climax, Inc.*
