Biographical Note: (Who was/is this person?) James Easton Brodhead (1932-2012) was a character actor who worked in various motion picture, television, and theatre productions. From 1950-1963, Brodhead appeared in numerous stage and live television productions. In 1963, Brodhead changed careers and became a journalist with "Time" magazine from 1963-1969, covering various stories including the assassination of Robert Kennedy and the ensuing trial of Sirhan Sirhan. He then left "Time" to write a book on "Rowan and Martin's Laugh-In," and worked as a public relations account executive for a short time. In 1971, he returned to acting full-time, appearing in "The Apple Dumpling Gang," "The Strongest Man in the World," "Kotch," "Mame," and "General Hospital," among many other motion picture, television, and theatre productions.

Scope & Content Note: (What is this accretion about?) This accretion contains a variety of materials relating to James E Brodhead and his family. A number of personal and professional photographs are included within this collection. The accretion also contains James Brodhead's correspondence with a variety of personal and professional sources. Newspaper clippings relating to the life and work of James Brodhead are located in this accretion. The accretion contains an edited CD of some of James Brodhead's television work.
