Mining Act, helped to establish more state control of natural resources, reduced income taxation, established greater 5th										
Amendment protection for private property owners, and supported a more aggressive role in U.S. Defense policy. After										
retirement in 1995, he founded the Frontiers of Freedom Institute, a policy group.
